Why 45 Grandview Street is now known as “Willendon”

Pymble Dental Practice resides in a beautiful and heritage-listed property which is commonly known throughout the Pymble community as ‘Willendon’.

Our practice on the corner of Station Street and Grandview Street was built in the late 1890s and originally leased as a school possibly called “Mountain View”. In 1904 it was sold to the Walker family and renamed Collogalla; which it was known until it was repurposed to an Oral Surgery and Dental Practice in 1971.

These three oral surgeons and dentists were Bill Suthers, Len Hansen and Haddon Kemp. **Will-Len-Don** is a portmanteau of their first names and that is how the more commonly known name of Willendon was derived.
